Non-Suicidal Self-Harm: Conceptualization and a Clinical Intervention. By Amy Cunningham, PsyD Beck Institute Faculty. Non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI) is defined as an act of intentional self-inflicted bodily harm without suicidal intent, for purposes that are not socially-sanctioned. NSSI has been linked to numerous psychiatric disorders, including borderline personality disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, and eating disorders.

### Non-Suicidal Self-Injury in Adolescents

Nonsuicidal self-injury (NSSI) refers to any premeditated, self-directed actions that leads to direct damage of body tissues (Kerr, Muehlenkamp, & Turner, 2010)This action is often marked in an array of ways, like hitting or punching an object to inflict injury to self, cutting, extreme scratching, skin carving, and interference with wound healing and burning.

People who engage in non-suicidal self-injury are at higher risk of a suicide attempt. About 10% of people who had injured themselves in the last four weeks had made a suicide attempt in the last year, and about 60% had had thoughts of suicide.

Non-suicidal self-injury can include a wide variety of behaviors, but common forms include cutting, self-scratching, burning, and punching objects. The risk of NSSI is particularly high in adolescence: the mean age at onset peaks around the age of 14-15. A second peak is common around the age of 20 in college samples.

## **Predicting the incidence of non-suicidal self-injury in ...**

Nonsuicidal self-injury is a self-inflicted act that causes pain or superficial damage but is not intended to cause death. Although the methods used sometimes overlap with those of suicide attempts (eg, cutting the wrists with a razor blade), nonsuicidal self-injury is distinct from suicide because patients do not intend the acts to be lethal.

## **Suicidal thoughts, suicidal behaviours and self-harm in ...**

Non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI) is defined as deliberately injuring oneself without suicidal intent. The most common form of NSSI is self-cutting, but other forms include burning, scratching, hitting, intentionally preventing wounds from healing, and other similar behaviors. Tattoos and body piercings are not considered NSSI, unless they are created with the specific intention to self-harm.

## **Non-suicidal Self-injury (NSSI) in Adult Psychiatric ...**

As indicated, nonsuicidal self-injury has long been regarded as a "symptom" of borderline personality disorder, even though comprehensive clinical evaluations have found that most individuals with nonsuicidal self-injury have symptoms that also meet criteria for other diagnoses, with eating disorders and substance use disorders being especially common.

## **Bing: Non Suicidal Self Injury In**

Non-suicidal self injury (NSSI): A form of intentional physical self-damage or self-harm that is not accompanied by suicidal intent or ideation. Examples of NSSI include cutting, burning, stabbing, or excessive rubbing. The behaviors of NSSI are performed with the expectation that the injury produced will be minor to moderate and will not be life-threatening.

## **WHAT IS NON-SUICIDAL SELF-INJURY?**

Nonsuicidal self-injury (NSSI) is the deliberate, self-inflicted destruction of body tissue resulting in immediate damage, without suicidal intent and for purposes not culturally sanctioned. Self-injury can include a variety of behaviors but is most commonly associated with: ◦ intentional carving or cutting of the skin

## **The Cornell Research Program on Self-Injury and Recovery**

Purpose of review: Non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI) is a common mental health threat among adolescents. This review aims to present the current literature on epidemiology, etiology, and therapeutic approaches with a focus on the period of adolescence. Recent findings: NSSI is widespread among adolescents both in community as well as in clinical settings with lifetime prevalence rates between 17 and 60% in recent studies.

## **Non-Suicidal Self-Injury on College Campuses - Higher ...**

BACKGROUND: Despite increased awareness that non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI) poses a significant public health concern on college campuses worldwide, few studies have prospectively investigated the incidence of NSSI in college and considered targeting college entrants at high risk for onset of NSSI.
