Skin tear prevalence and associated risk factors in long ...

Findings demonstrated a skin tear prevalence of 6.2%; all skin tears were found to be hospital-acquired and located on the extremities. Most (78%) were in the age range of 70-89 years. There was a dearth in nursing documentation of the skin tears identified and their management.

RESULTS: Of the 128 participating residents six had skin tears, yielding a prevalence of 4.6 %. In total, 10 skin tears were observed in the 6 residents. The frequency of previous skin tears was 19.5 %. This frequency was significantly higher in residents with skin tears than in those without skin tears (83.3 % versus 16.4 %, $p < 0.001$).

The prevalence of skin tears in this study (11.4%) matches other international observations. The following risk factors were recognised: previous skin tear, ecchymosis and risk of falling. These factors could be used to identify patients requiring prevention of skin tears.

Studies in acute care settings have reported skin tear prevalence to be between 3.3% and 17% [6,. In long-term care facilities, skin tear prevalence is slightly higher, ranging from 3.9% to 26%.

Prevalence of skin tears in a long-term care facility

To support their work, the authors cite the results of a 1994 research, which was conducted in a 347-bed facility. The study revealed a 41.5% skin tear prevalence rate within the target population. The authors' findings reveal skin tear as a more common health issue among the elderly groups when compared to the situation among the young generation.

Skin Tears: Prevention and Management Strategies

The highest incidence was found in a retrospective study conducted in the United States, in which 321 skin tears were detected in 349 patients over 1 year, resulting in an incidence rate of 92% (ie, 0.92 skin tears per patient per year). 9 However, the authors suggested that this incidence rate could be up to 3 times higher than that found because the records for this type of wound usually are not accurate. 9

Data on skin tear prevalence and potential risk factors were collected over a period of five months using patient records and skin observations. Each skin observation was performed by the researcher in collaboration with a local nurse. Data were analyzed using descriptive statistics, univariate and multiple logistic regression.

Skin tears are generally more common among individuals in long-term care, with reported prevalence rates ranging from 10-54% across different countries. 5-9 Individuals with skin tears are also often seen in the emergency department, with estimates ranging between 0.6%-6.1% per 1,000 attendances. 10-13 Prevalence in acute care has been reported between 3.3 and 22%. 14-16 The prevalence of individuals with skin tears presenting to their GP practice is unknown but anecdotal evidence suggests ...

A more recent survey found prevalence was 8-11% in public hospitals in Western Australia (Wounds-West, 2009). The work carried out in Australia led Carville et al (2007) to conclude that skin tears are perceived to be common wounds and occur more frequently than pressure ulcers.
