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Jack Pierce was seen as a pioneer in special effects makeup. He created creatures for Frankenstein (1931), Dracula (1931), The Mummy (1932) and The Wolf Man

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(1941). To create the head piece for the character (photo on the left), Collodion and cotton were placed in layers.
